21	I, Debra Resler, declare as follows:
22	I am over age 18 and I have been actively involved with the City of Escondido Public
23	Library issue that is the subject of this action.
24	2. I have personal knowledge of the matters stated herein and if called upon by the court
25	would so testify.
26	3. I was completely shocked and incredibly disappointed when the Escondido City Council
27	voted to proceed with a contract to have Library Systems & Services LLC (LS&S), a

private, for-profit Maryland venture capital firm, to manage our public library.

- 4. I attended and participated in Library Board of Trustee meetings and several Escondido City Council meetings. I could not believe the Council had listened to the same testimonies that I had witnessed and still decided to make this unfortunate decision thereby ignoring the will of citizens and the Library Board of Trustees who is charged with the duties of management of our Public Library.
- During those meetings, hundreds of Escondido residents spoke eloquently and passionately against privatization and, in particular, the contract with LS&S. They, like I, believe that a public library should be managed by the local government through its Board of Trustees and NOT by a for-profit entity. Many of the speakers had data showing that LS&S was not maintaining a reasonable quality of library staff or resources in the branches that it managed.
- 6. One of the biggest concerns I have with this City Council decision is the ridiculously insufficient process that was used to make this decision. A 10-year, multi-million dollar contract was awarded during a process where goals, metrics, and performance measures were essentially undefined.
- 7. Moreover, in what is not even allowed to happen in a number of other public institutions, no other competitive bids or proposals were considered. A 10-year, multi-million dollar contract was awarded without the consideration of any other proposals. In fact, the Council ignored a request to submit a budget proposal that was made by the former Escondido Library Director. The Council also ignored the Library Board of Trustees, who voted unanimously to oppose this outsourcing, and the more than 4,000 Escondido residents who signed a petition against privatization of our library.
- 8. Finally, even though the Council was informed of a possible legal conflict regarding the LS&S contract, they still voted to move ahead, rather than take some time to research and investigate. This kind of decision-making does not show common sense, nor does it serve the City of Escondido or its residents.
- 9. Decisions of this magnitude need to be made in an open, public and inclusive way,

evaluating all reasonable alternatives. That is the reason why the California Education Code requires a Library Board of Trustees manage the Public Library and not a political organization like the City Council.

I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California that the foregoing is true and correct.
