22	I, Brenda Townsend, declare as follows:
23	1. I am a resident of the City of Escondido and over the age of 18. I was an active
24	participant in the citizens' effort to protect our public library from the political whims of
25	the City of Escondido City Council.
26	2. I have personal knowledge of the matters stated herein and if called upon, I would so
27	testify.
28	3. As a resident of Escondido for the last 30 years, I am distraught beyond belief with the
	Garrett v. City of Escondido, 37-2017-00045061-CU-WM-NC Motion for TRO/Preliminary Injunction, etc.

City Council's recent decision to privatize our beloved public library. City employees and volunteers have run this wonderful organization for 123 years, and now power has been transferred to an out-of-state entity with questionable credentials. Against the advice of the ALA, retired City Librarians, thousands of Escondido citizens and library users of all ages, and its own Library Board of Trustees, Mayor Sam Abed, and the Escondido City Council majority have absolved themselves of any responsibility of the day-to-day running of the library.

- 4. The whole plan to privatize was not even supposed to have been made widely known, and had it not been for Escondido Councilperson, Olga Diaz, who came across the information buried in some random financials, no one would have had any knowledge of this process.
- 5. The entire quest for "transparency" was a sham from the beginning. The City Council put the onus on the Library Board of Trustees to hold meetings all summer, but when push came to shove in the October 18, 2017, vote, the Library Board of Trustees' decision was ignored and all pretense was cast aside.
- 6. Perspective of the current action by the City Council is given by some history: A city-ordered Grand Jury Report was misinterpreted to cast our wonderful library and its staff in a bad light. That report accurately found that the current library holdings and building are insufficient to serve a city of 152,000 people. In 2007, the City Council ordered the closure of the East Valley Branch Library, with little fanfare, notice, or input from citizens. This action happened despite library advocacy groups raising the amount of necessary funds that were required to save the EVBL from the closure, and that money was offered to the city as a gift. The City Council ignored the financial gift and the plans went forward with the closure, with the building being leased, instead, to a charter school. This recent decision smacks of the same deception that we experienced at the hands of City Council majority 10 years ago.
- 7. Officials were asked to slow down the process in April, when this information first came to light. Citizens respectfully worked with the Library Board of Trustees, who are

charged with the management of the Public Library, and asked for more time to explore other money-saving options, such as joining the San Diego County library system, or other options. These requests were not only rejected by the unlawful action of the City Council on October 18, 2017, who ignored the Library Board of Trustees and over 4000 citizens who signed a petition, but City Council vote was shoved through without any other proposals or bids.

8. Now we have an foreign private company that we don't want set to take over our lone, remaining library on January 15th. What is the rush to make a hasty decision about something so important that will affect thousands of lives over the course of many years? We respectfully request a Motion for Injunction to stay the implementation of the private service contract with LS&S so that a full hearing may be heard on the merits.
